The Affordable Medications Program

Find out how you might qualify for help with out-of-pocket costs toward your prescriptions



At the UVM Health Network, we want to make sure that cost doesn't keep you from getting the care you need.

HOW THE PROGRAM WORKS

- Designed to help low- and middle-income patients obtain their prescriptions at no cost.
- You may qualify, even if you have insurance.

IF YOU QUALIFY

- All co-pays and costs are waived for both brand name and generic prescriptions. For example, a family of four with a household income of \$100,000 could save up to \$600 per month on out-of-pocket costs at the pharmacy.
- Medications are provided by UVM Health Network pharmacies and will be conveniently mailed to your home.

IN ADDITION TO PRESCRIPTION ASSISTANCE, THE HEALTH ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (HAP) ALSO PROVIDES:

- Screening to see if you may qualify for other hospital programs or community resources such as grants for medical bills or access to eyeglasses or medical equipment.
- Assistance with enrollment in state and federal programs, including obtaining insurance through the Vermont Health Connect exchange.
- Advocacy and support with obtaining health care related resources.
